WHAT IS A HAZARD?



A **HAZARD** is any existing or potential condition that can lead to:

- * Injury or illness; or death
- * Damage to or loss of a system, equipment, or property
- * Damage to the environment



BE A LIFESAVER...

Security

Unauthorized personnel
Unsecured gates/fences
Piggybacking



AIRPORT HAZARDS IV



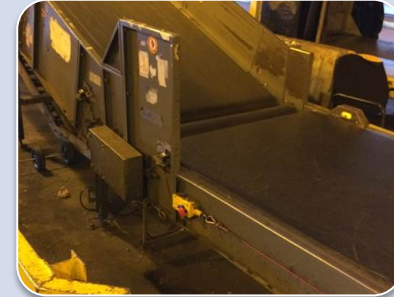
Deficient maintenance of ground support equipment, baggage carts, and vehicles



Improper Parking of Ground Service Equipment

Distracted Driving

Unsafe speed of vehicles



Malfunctioning Conveyor Belts

Use of Poor Body Mechanics

Failure to follow Lock Out/Tag Out Procedures
